Literacy

In literacy this term, we will be focusing on the following topics based around writing, reading and comprehension and speaking and listening.

- Narrative writing
- Grammar
- punctuation
- o capital letters
- full stops
- question marks
- explanation marks

- Comprehension skills
 - o using prior knowledge
 - predicting
 - summarising has
 - o identifying the main idea
- Speeches for the Student Representative Council
- Presentation skills including tone, pace, volume and voice projection, expression, stance and eye contact

At home you could...

- encourage your child to read daily
- · ask questions about what your child is reading
- discuss characters in books and films
- talk about the current events in the news
- encourage them to identify persuasive texts in newspapers, catalogues and advertisements
- check to see if their writing contains punctuation marks in the correct places


Numeracy

In numeracy this term, we will be focusing on the following topics based around number and place value, measurement and geometry.

- Place value of 5, 6 and 7 digit numbers
- Counting
- Number facts
- Mental and written strategies for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division
- Perimeter

At home you could...

- test your child on their knowledge of related addition and subtraction number facts
- identify numbers in your environment
- talk to your child about how numbers are used in cooking, temperature, shopping, time




Social and Emotional Learning

In SEL this term, we will be focusing on leadership skills and looking into creating student action teams. We will also have a strong focus on mindfulness and how it can benefit us in our learning and in our lives.

- Persistence and Growth Mindset
 - Not giving up and challenging yourself to finish a task
- Enthusiasm
 - Being positive and having a good attitude towards learning and school activities
- Problem Solving
 - Being creative and thinking in different ways in order to solve a problem
- Collaboration
 - Working together as a team in order to achieve a shared goal
- Communication and Student Voice
 - Using positive communication skills in order to achieve shared goals
 - Using your Student Voice in order to give and receive feedback
- Mindfulness
 - Taking time to calm our minds and bodies to prepare for learning, to assist managing our emotions and when problem solving

At home you could...

- ask your child about how they are demonstrating good leadership
- encourage your child to use the 'Growth Mindset' model (Eg. I can do it, I will succeed, I can't do it...YET
- ask your child/children to share a mindfulness strategy they know with you at home



Faith Based Inquiry

In Faith-Based Inquiry this term we will be focusing on the topic 'Discovery' with a focus on the exploration of Australian history and all

who have settled here over the ages. From the Aboriginals, to the First European settlers, to the 20th Century migration of many cultures Post World War 2 and beyond.



At home you could...

- Discuss your family's experiences migrating from another country.
- What were the reasons?
- What were the challenges?
- What were the successes?
- What are the special cultural experiences/celebrations you have shared with Australians?



Discussions will centre around:

- Reasons for migrating
- Migration experiences
 - Challenges
 - Successes





- Impact various migrant groups have had on Australian culture:
 - Religion
 - Food
 - Sport
 - Music
 - Theatre

Year 6 students who have already enrolled in a Catholic high school:

Year 6 students wishing to attend a public Secondary school:

Transition packs will be available in next couple of months. Families will need to fill in the application form and send it back to their preferred high school by the due date.

This information is not available yet - the teachers will keep you up to date and let you know when you can start enrolling.
