Gospel

Mt 3:1-12

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew "All people shall see the salvation of God."



The people of Israel had turned away from God's love. He had promised to send them a saviour, but first he sent someone to prepare the people to welcome the Son of God. Our theme this week is "prepare the way". It is always important to prepare well for important events. Things may need to be tidied or repaired. We may have to buy something new or clean something that has been neglected. The more carefully we prepare the more successful the event is likely to be.
